



#### STATEWIDE CONFERENCE CALL SUMMARY

- Current positivity rate in Florida is at around 7.9%, with 3,900 new cases over the weekend.
- We are currently seeing a decrease in hospitalizations along with COVID like illnesses.
- Additional Remdesivir is being sent out this week, and convalescent plasma remains available at this time still.
- This virus still proves to be most dangerous to those with underlying conditions or those 65 years of age and older. Working with AHCA to keep COVID out of ALFs and LTCs remains a top priority.
- Practicing and encouraging mitigation measures such as wearing masks, washing hands and social distancing remain incredibility important to ensure patients do not contract COVID. Specifically. for those with internal medicine practices and geriatric programs.
- New CDC info states they are moving away from testing bases approaches. It has been shown the virus can be detected in those who have had it for up to 3 months, but is only culturable for about 10 days. If the virus cannot culture, those individuals are likely not infectious.
- We are seeing a 40% decline in hospitalizations since the peak last month. and a 27% decline in ICU numbers. We are also seeing some decline in the LTC settings.
- Ensure lab results are being report as quickly as possible, both positive and negative.
- Bi-weekly testing in NH. ALFs has been beneficial in identifying asymptomatic cases. This testing has been implemented for intermediate care facilities and APD groups and will be picking up this week.

## ESS INFORMATION FOR REPORTING FACILITIES

- ESS is critically important for the State to anticipate demand in the hospital & sub-acute care setting. This data influences decisions on the need for additional support and equipment requests from federal government.
- Facilities MUST verify and update data once daily.
- ESS is adding more fields daily. Instructions on these new fields available on the AHCA ESS website.
- · Hospitals should estimate the number of med surge beds that can be converted to ICU beds. Do not duplicate bed numbers in different categories. Start with highest acuity beds.
- · Corporate Representatives can be established to monitor data entry at individual facilities. Contact AHCA for assistance


