





STATEWIDE CONFERENCE CALL SUMMARY

- 80.000 positive cases with 12.000 Hospitalized and 2.900 deaths at this point in Florida.
- ESS data entry remains to be of the utmost importance. Due to it being manually entered. please ensure that information is being entered correctly so partners throughout the state and nation can respond and prepare accordingly.
- There has been an increase in cases and the positivity rate over the past weeks. This can be contributed to the increase of testing in the state in addition to increased spread in certain areas of the state. There has also been an increase flu and COVID type illness being reported.
- The state still has an ample supply of Remdesivir for facilities in need.
- Wearing facemasks and practicing proper hand hygiene. especially with alcohol-based hand sanitizer. are the two most promising mitigation practices and all persons within the state are encouraged to continue practicing these measures and making them available within their facilities.
- Keeping COVID outside of nursing homes remains to be a top priority.
- There are currently 6 COVID isolation units set up throughout the state.
- 10 to 15% of current hospital admissions are coming from Long Term Care Facilities.





Big Bend HCC Situation Reports will now be going out once a week on Wednesdays.

ESS INFORMATION FOR REPORTING FACILITIES

- ESS is critically important for the State to anticipate demand in the hospital & sub-acute care setting. This data influences decisions on the need for additional support and equipment requests from federal government.
- Facilities MUST verify and update data once daily.
- ESS is adding more fields daily. Instructions on these new fields available on the AHCA ESS website.
- · Hospitals should estimate the number of med surge beds that can be converted to ICU beds. Do not duplicate bed numbers in different categories. Start with highest acuity beds.
- · Corporate Representatives can be established to monitor data entry at individual facilities. Contact AHCA for assistance

Florida's 5 STEPS to Prevent COVID-19

STOP INTRODUCTION

Stop Introduction into Florida from out of state.

TEST. TEST. TEST Leverage testing capabilities & work to expand capacity.

ELDERLY & VULNERABLE PROTECTION

Protect the elderly by increased mitigation and messaging at assisted living centers, nursing homes, and other special facilities.

PREPARE HOSPITALS

Assess the potential impacts and course of action for hospitals and bed capacity.

SOCIAL DISTANCING

Continue to message social distancing.
